


PILLAR

FORAGE RAPE

A fast establishing, high yielding, multi-graze giant-type forage rape with strong re-growth potential and good disease resistance.

Pillar is a modern forage rape, developed for our farming conditions. It can be used as a multi-graze forage crop, sown in either spring or autumn to provide fast establishing summer or autumn/winter feed. Pillar is suitable for all livestock types and farming systems and is an ideal break crop as part of a pasture renovation programme.



Agronomic traits

- Sowing season: Spring or Autumn
- Maturity (days to graze): 80-110
- Number of grazings: 2-4*
- Aphid tolerance: Moderate - good
- Minimum rainfall (mms): 600+ or irrigated
- Disease resistance: Good
- Sowing rate (kg/ha): 3-4
