Being late flowering compared to many other plantains, Oracle holds its forage quality for longer into spring.

Ideal for use as a specialist forage crop, or inclusion in permanent mixtures. Suitable for all livestock types.

Agronomic traits

- Persistence (years): 2-3 *
- Heading date: Late
- Forage quality: High
- Growth peak: spring to autumn
- Sowing rate (kg/ha): Mixes: 1-2
Alone: 8-10

- A high performance broad-leaved plantain
- Higher overall dry matter yields
- Late heading giving livestock greater quality for longer into spring
- Higher forage quality and mineral content
- Good drought and heat tolerance
